Title: *A Resolution Authorizing Participation in the State of Oregon Local Government Certification Program*

WHEREAS, the National Park Service offers Local Government Certification that is administered by the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO); and

WHEREAS, the City of Dayton has found that it is in the best interest of its residents and the community to enter into a Local Government Certification Agreement with the State of Oregon;

The City of Dayton Resolves as follows:

- 1) **THAT** the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Local Government Certification Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A, and incorporated by reference herein; and
- 2) **THAT** this resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.



State of Oregon
Local Government Certification Agreement

Pursuant to the provisions of the 1980 amendments to the National Historic Preservation Act (P. L. 89-655), to applicable federal regulations (36 CFR 61), and to the State of Oregon procedures, the City/County of _____ has agreed to:

- (1) Enforce appropriate state or local legislation for the designation and protection of historic properties.
- (2) Maintain an adequate and qualified historic preservation review commission composed of professional and lay members.
- (3) Maintain a system for the survey and inventory of historic properties.
- (4) Provide for adequate public participation in the historic preservation program, including the process of recommending properties to the National Register.
- (5) Maintain adequate financial management systems.
- (6) Adhere to all requirements of the *Historic Preservation Fund Grants Manual*.
- (7) Adhere to any requirements mandated by Congress regarding use of federal historic preservation funds.
- (8) Adhere to requirements outlined in the *State of Oregon Local Government Participation Procedures* issued by the State Historic Preservation Office.
- (9) Satisfactorily perform the responsibilities delegated to it under the Act.
