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## **Objectives**

The objective of this project was to relevel, reset, and or repair all of the high- and medium-priority grave markers identified in the <u>2018 Brookside Preservation Plan</u>. Historic Preservation Northwest (HPNW) was hired by the City of Dayton to carry out the work in June 2019. At the start of the project in July, the total was 91 markers. By the end of the project in September, the total was 121 markers.

## Methodology

HPNW follows the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Resources. All interventions with grave markers were made starting with the gentlest means first. When any material needed to be replaced (such as new naturally hydraulic lime mortar for deteriorated lime mortar), the new, in-kind material matched in composition, design, color, texture, and all visual properties. Any substitute materials (such as Akepox 2010 epoxy to repair a thin, broken headstone), were used on a limited basis and only when the substitute materials would match the general properties of the historic material and would not damage the grave marker. Only gravel was used to level the grave markers; no concrete or cement was employed.

All work was done by David Pinyerd and Bernadette Niederer of HPNW. Both are graduates of the Historic Preservation master's degree program at the University of Oregon, 2000 and 2006, respectively. Both trained in cemetery preservation under the tutelage of Bruce Howard and Sally Donovan.

## Results

The work on most of the 91 grave markers went as proposed in the initial survey from 2018; however, once one begins to dig, there are always surprises. For example, on the cover of this report is a grave marker where we thought the bottom portion of the headstone was missing; however, it had merely been buried over time. For the most part, the initial proposed treatments were accurate. We ended up using about 50lbs of natural hydraulic lime to reset stones and about 600 grams of Akepox 2010 epoxy to repair stones. We also used about three yards of gravel (provided by the City) to level grave markers.

We found 10 footstones buried, propping up monuments. Coupled with the 20 "loose footstones" scattered around the cemetery, the situation led us to take on an additional task of repatriating as many footstones as we could identify and taking the rest to off-site storage. This led to the increase from the original 91 markers to 121 markers that we dealt with. This is discussed in detail in the next section.

All work on the 121 grave markers was completed by HPNW in July-September 2019. Details on what we did to each marker, along with pictures of the process, are in Appendix A.

### **Misplaced Footstone Protocol**

We developed a protocol for handling misplaced footstones. Misplaced footstones are footstones that are lying loose in the cemetery and are not "set" in the ground. We began with 20 misplaced footstones and then uncovered an additional 10 footstones while releveling gravestones.

If the misplaced footstone had no initials carved into it, then we recorded the stone's provenience and took a photo. We labeled the bottom edge of the stone with an inventory number in soft pencil. The stone was then put in a paper bag, labeled with its inventory number and provenience, and put in off-site storage.

If the misplaced stone had initials carved into it, we consulted the alphabetic list of burials. If the initials matched a burial and there was no footstone associated with that burial, then we moved the footstone to the new location after carefully recording where the stone came from and where it was reset. Any repatriated footstones are noted and described in the database.

If the misplaced stone had initials, but there were multiple burials with the same initials, then we picked the most likely burial that matched in style and period. This situation only occurred in one instance.

If the burial location was within a curbed family plot, then we reset the footstone at the foot of the grave. If the burial location was outside of a curbed family plot, then we reset the footstone directly behind the gravestone to protect it.

If the misplaced stone had initials, but there was no burial that matched, then we labeled an edge in pencil, photographed, recorded in the database, and removed the footstone to the offsite storage.

See Appendix B for a list of 19 stone objects put into off-site storage. Each stone object has an object number in a "A99" format, where "A" distinguishes stone.

## **Misplaced Objects Protocol**

While working in the cemetery, we found 10 items other than footstones that were "loose" in the cemetery. All of these items were metal and most were temporary grave markers that were lying flat on the ground. These objects were labeled in pencil, photographed, recorded in the database, and removed to off-site storage.

See Appendix B for a list of the objects put into off-site storage. Each metal object has an object number in a "B99" format, where "B" distinguishes metal.

## Recommendations

After spending 20 days this summer working in the cemetery from one end to the other, we've observed a few things that we think should be next steps that are relatively easy to tackle:

1. Cut back the ivy. One stone (#20-11) has already started to disappear into the ivy again! Trimming it back now with clippers and uprooting what you can will be much easier than having to trim it with a chainsaw in a year or two.

- 2. Cut back the filbert suckers. Filberts are attempting to come back with a vengeance in two places.
- 3. We don't recommend cleaning stones very often but this cemetery needs a good cleaning. Methodically, row by row. We cleaned four stones and it was like night and day. Follow the cleaning method described in the Preservation Plan. We left the final step of cleaning on all but four of the 121 stones that we dealt with so there is plenty of embedded dirt and moss that is just itching to come off.
- 4. Clean up the non-organic trash. There are a lot of broken pieces of glass and plastic scattered throughout the cemetery, most of which are former flower holders. We saw nothing that needs to be kept that we didn't already move to off-site storage.
- 5. Clean up the organic trash. There are branches and roots scattered about the cemetery. We tossed our clippings over the south edge.
- 6. Pick up the piles of loose concrete and brick. We left several piles of broken up concrete and brick within family plots mostly along the south edge. Decide on a repository where they can be piled in case there are worries about throwing out something important. Basically, anything that isn't stone with a right angle edge can be tossed. Stone is pretty obvious versus concrete once you look at enough of it. There are many pieces of broken curbing that should also be removed. They only serve as water traps in many cases and cannot be reused for restoration.
- 7. Mount a "realtor box" to the new wooden sign post next to the information sign. Put a list of the burials in number order, a list of the burials in alphabetic order, and a map in the box for visitors to borrow when they visit. Put "Please Return" on the box and papers.
- 8. Fill some of the depressions and holes in the walking paths with gravel and dirt. Walking back and forth day after day we found the cemetery is quite uneven and there are legitimate trip hazards with some of the holes.

All of these items can be accomplished by volunteers. They are all great ways to build camaraderie and to build your volunteer base. Accomplishing these eight items will go a long way towards sprucing up the cemetery and keeping it under control.

## **Appendix A: Markers Treated**

As part of the <u>Preservation Plan</u> HPNW wrote for the cemetery in 2018, an inventory record for each marker was created along with a map. This inventory included the treatment needs of each stone.

In June 2019, HPNW was hired by the City of Dayton to treat each of the markers flagged as needing high- or medium-priority treatment. A matching grant was awarded by State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) through the City's Certified Local Government (CLG) program, and the work for each of those markers was done by HPNW in September-October 2019. This appendix records the work performed on each marker.

The report shows a planned treatment and an actual treatment with a date. The treatment date is the date treatment was started, as most stones took at least two visits to complete. The leftmost photo is the photo taken when the stone was initially inventoried in July 2018. The three adjacent photos are the photos taken during the treatment process, with the rightmost photo being a final photo of the stone. Photo file names are vertically oriented to the left of each photo. Each photo file name starts with a "99-99" label which corresponds to the stone's inventory number in the database.

## **Appendix B: Objects to Storage**

In September 2019, we took 19 stone items and 10 metal items from the cemetery to the city-owned, off-site storage. These items were "loose" in the cemetery and were subject to the <u>misplaced footstone protocol</u> described earlier in this report. For the most part, the stones removed were marble with either no markings or markings that did not make their proper location obvious. The metal items are mostly temporary grave markers with no identifying information.

Each "loose" item was labeled in pencil with an object number and put in a paper bag with its provenience and object number. This appendix contains the same information. The object number in a "A99" format, where "A" distinguishes stone and "B" distinguishes metal. A copy of this appendix should be placed with the artifacts in the off-site storage location in a zip-lock bag.

The off-site location is a storage locker in the former Fisher Farm storage building owned by the City. The five-bay, metal building is about 100 yards east of the intersection of Hwy 233 and Hwy 154. The storage locker is inside the westernmost bay of the green building.
