

Minutes of Meeting of February 14, 2024

The meeting was opened by Chairperson Judy Gerrard at 6:31 p.m.

Appearance of Interested Citizens

None in attendance.

Approval of Minutes

Vice Chair Kelly Haverkate made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 10, 2024 meeting, Dave Hargett seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

CLG Grant Update

Chair Judy Gerrard asked that examples of other cemetery story maps be shared to the Committee members. The story maps for Oak Grove Cemetery, Daughters of Zion Cemetery, Brier Hill Cemetery, West Port Cemetery, and Oakwood Cemetery were discussed. Committee members identified features of each site that could ideally be included in the Brookside story map project.

Everyone was in favor of a horizontal menu along the top of the site, along with a banner image of the cemetery. Other items the Committee would like to include are an interactive, searchable map and drone footage of Brookside. Rather than focusing on information that was included in the nomination of the site to the National Register of Historic Places like some other maps included, the Committee would like to focus on the stories of the people resting in Brookside and the restoration of the cemetery.

Some things that the Committee agreed should not be included on the story map are too much information, hard to read text in popup windows, text that floats over images, and maps that are too busy.

Future projects or updates to the story map could include integration of information from the newspaper digitization project in the future and linking people in Brookside to properties on the map of all the sites on the National Register in Dayton.

Cemetery Grant

Chairperson Gerrard was wondering if the City should pursue a Cemetery Grant for the current grant cycle. The Committee brainstormed some ideas including a printed map available to visitors at the site, a sign that has a map of the cemetery on it, and electronic tags for markers for a future interactive map. The Committee would like verification if row markers can be grant-funded, and if they can, what would be easiest to maintain from the Public Works perspective?

Dear Dave Rucklos:

Thank you for submitting information for the undertaking referenced above. We concur that the Courthouse Square Park is listed in the National Register of Historic Places and that the Bandstand is a non-historic, non-contributing structure within the park. We also concur that there will be no adverse effect on historic properties for this undertaking.

Our finding is based on the understanding that the overall size and dimensions of the Bandstand are not changing and that the materials used for this project will be the same as are already on the structure, although dimensions may change slightly. We understand that the exception is the new wire railing, but the change in the railing type does not adversely affect the park. We also find that replacing the stairs with either wood or concrete does not impact the park as long as the number and dimensions of the steps remain the same. Please note that a separate archaeological review will be required if excavation is needed to install the steps.

This concludes consultation with our office under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (per 36 CFR Part 800) and Oregon Revised State (ORS) 358.653 for built-environment resources. If the undertaking design or effect changes or additional historic properties are identified, further consultation with our office will be necessary before proceeding with the proposed undertaking. Additional consultation regarding this case must be sent through Go Digital. To help us track the undertaking accurately, reference the SHPO case number above in all correspondence.



Dayton's Historic Brookside Cemetery Mapping and StoryMap Project

COG GIS staff recently completed a project for the city of Dayton to map their historic Brookside Cemetery and created a web map application and StoryMap. Over a year in the making, the project was funded by a grant from the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). Dayton has been awarded SHPO grants during every grant cycle since 2017. In the last seven years, the funds have allowed the city to restore grave markers, create new signage, inventory the grave markers, create a 10-year preservation plan, remove diseased and dangerous trees, ivy, and other vegetation, restore water to the property, and hold a "best practices" workshop for Public Works staff.


In 2022, with some grant funds remaining from another project, the city approached COG about creating a web map of their historic properties. The city has 40 properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and the purpose of the web map was to display their locations along with a suggested walking route and provide information about each property in a pop-up window when users click on a property. The request came only about a month before the grant funds needed to be spent, but GIS staff had created a historic properties map about ten years previous, so it was a good starting point. The project was completed in August 2022, and city staff and the members of their Historic Preservation Committee were pleased with the end product- so pleased, that they inquired whether their cemetery could be mapped. They were inspired by a StoryMap they had seen from the [city of Sisters](#) on their historic downtown and envisioned something similar for the historic Brookside Cemetery. They applied for a SHPO grant in early 2023 and it was awarded in April of that year. GIS staff worked with data that had been collected during the cemetery restoration in 2018-2019, as well as additional data provided by the Historic Preservation Committee, to create the web map application and accompanying StoryMap. The result is a simple web tool that allows users to click on grave marker features to see information on them (including photos of grave markers) and, most importantly, search on names to locate grave markers, which had not been possible before. The StoryMap highlights the history of Dayton, Brookside Cemetery and some of the notable people and families interred there, and the cemetery restoration project. Both the historic properties web map and the Brookside Cemetery web application can be accessed through the StoryMap. See the Brookside Cemetery StoryMap [here](#).
